

**Paradise Lake Improvement Board  
Minutes – November 5, 2021**

The meeting began at 7 P.M.

Present were: Paul Teike, Arden Bawkey, John Siegel, Toni Drier, Ash Alt

**Minutes:** Moved by Bawkey, seconded by Alt to accept the minutes from the August 25, 2021, Budget Public Hearing and Regular Meeting. Motion passed on unanimous vote.

**Correspondence:** Drier reported on correspondence received since the last meeting. All will be available for viewing at the end of the meeting.

**Treasurer:** Alt presented a report from the last month along with a listing of bills to be paid. Moved by Bawkey, seconded by Siegel to accept the treasurer's report and pay the bills. Passed unanimously.

Alt reported that he was still laptop shopping.

**RLS Report:** Mike Solomon reported that approximately 390 A of EWM were treated. Prior to treatment 60.% of the lake was impacted. The final survey showed only 0.7% of the lake impacted. Treatment has been budgeted for 2022 but will rely on results of a survey in the spring. If less than 10 A. need treatment, DASH could be used. (See complete report on website.)

**New Business:**

The meeting schedule for 2022 was set for the second Wednesday of May, July, August and November. The August meeting will begin with the Budget Public Hearing followed by the regular meeting. All meetings begin at 7 P.M. and zoom will be provided for residents only who cannot attend in person.

The board voted to accept the Management Agreement with the PLA as written. Roll call vote: All aye.

The board approved a contract with RLS for Lake Management services for 2022. Roll call vote: all aye. Moved by Drier, seconded by Siegel to allow the Chair to sign the contract and addendum.

The PLM contract is the same as last year with a slight cost increase in chemical costs. The contract is for three years. This allows the Board to hold down costs. Moved by Drier, seconded by Alt to accept the three year contract. Roll call vote: all aye.

**Public Comment:** Has the electricity to generators been turned off? If so, when must it be turned back on so as not to incur installation costs? *It has not been turned off.*

No further comments from those present.

Zoom Comments: Justin remarked that he is glad for the results and excited about the progress. *Mike Solomon stated that there are still potential problems with Hebron Twp. A discussion followed.* P.C. stated difficulty logging in to zoom.
