General Meeting called to order by Tamlyn at 2:07 pm.

Presentation explaining the proposed program 2012-2016 by Jennifer Jones, Consultant, Lakeshore Environmental.

Questions were taken by the consultant that explained how the diffusers work, how long the system would be used for, how loud the compressors will be, how the fish habitat would be affected and many other questions raised by the audience. M Smith – commented favorably on the project. Thanked the board for their work and dedication to the improvement of the lake and the fishery. Carp Lake Township was thanked for contributing to the cost of the project.

T Faes – Commented with mixed feelings about the project. Wants a sewer.

J Russel – commented on N. Hayes Lane does not support the project because he is located on the other side of 31.

General Meeting resumed at 3:17 pm

J Mallory – commented on the fact that she did not know about the board or was aware that a special assessment was being considered. Thinks that they should have a say and a public ballot. Thinks the whole township should be assessed. Not just the people near the water.

Tamlyn explained the power of the board to create the special assessment district. That the board is created by the State of Michigan and was granted powers by the State to create the assessment.

Teike stated that 2 ½ years ago the Lake Improvement Board was created because a petition was circulated that would have given the Township Board power to fix the lake. 51% of the residents needed to sign the petition and that did not happen. The petition was circulated twice. He stated that, since its creation, the board has worked hard since this time to resolve the problem.

Teike explained that residents outside the thousand foot circle cannot be charged an assessment because a benefit cannot be proven for those people. A benefit can be proved for people within the thousand foot circle.

- T. Faes Does not agree with the assessment and wants a sewer. Wanted to know if a township wide referendum in five years would be possible. Teike stated that if a petition came before the board that was signed by 51% of the population of the township, then the board would move in that direction.

- D. VanPatten Webb wanted to know when the fee would be assessed. Summer!
- F. Reine Summer tax bill only?
- A. Merser Asked why the assessment was set at 1000 feet and a township wide assessment is not being considered. Tamlyn explained that a township wide assessment would not stand up in court.

A question was asked about whether the people of Hebron Township were being assessed. There is no interest from the east side of the lake to be involved in the project. Weevil damage will be monitored though. The Hebron township supervisor stated that they had one letter in favor of it and their attorney advised that they not get involved. He suggested that reaching out 1000 feet was perhaps too far.

Benefits or lack thereof to treating the lake to the people who live on the back lots were argued by two attendees.
